What is so Super ?

Isn't it interesting how a Sunday has become so connected with a sporting event that it has its own name, "Super Bowl Sunday?" For many in the American culture, Super Bowl Sunday has become another American holiday like Independence Day. Whether or not a person likes or understands football, it is a day of parties, festivities & family gatherings. But what is so Super?

Apart from or because of sports enthusiasts, the popularity of the Super Bowl, and many other forms of entertainment, may be a response to the sentiments expressed in our first reading today from Job:

Is not man's life on earth a drudgery?

Are not his days those of hirelings?

*He is a slave who longs for the shade,
a hireling who waits for his wages.*

*So I have been assigned months of misery,
and troubled nights have been allotted to me.*

When life seems monotonous and the meaning of our existence has faded, human beings look for distractions or ways to escape from an apparent lack of passion or hope. But a football game, no matter how exciting, or other distractions can only give us a break for a short time; they can never provide lasting meaning or fulfillment, even if our favorite team wins.

In contrast, the Good News of Jesus Christ does provide true hope and meaning for our lives. Man's life on earth is a drudgery and without hope for the one without a relationship with the LORD, because we have been made for the LORD. A bolt without a nut, a fishing line without a hook, or a swimming pool without water is incomplete. We could say they have not yet reached their purpose, their fulfillment. Similarly, human beings not only have been created in the image and likeness of God, but have been created for RELATIONSHIPS with the LORD and with others. We see in the healing St. Peter's mother-in-law, Jesus restoring not only her physical health, but also her capacity to serve others again. Illness can isolate and focus the person on themselves—on their pain, discomfort and limitations.

Jesus, the Word made Flesh, came to reveal the Way back to the Father. He not only taught us with authority about our Eternal Father's love for us and his merciful attitude toward those separated from him, but Jesus, as the Lamb of God, actually reconciles us to the Father. He also models for us the necessity to cultivate a deepening relationship with the Father. Let us use this coming Lent to grow in our relationships with God!

¿Qué es Tan Súper?

¿No es interesante cómo un domingo se ha relacionado tanto con un evento deportivo que tiene su propio nombre, "Domingo del Super Bowl"? Para muchos en la cultura estadounidense, el domingo del Super Bowl se ha convertido en otro feriado estadounidense como el Día de la Independencia. Le guste o no le guste o no entienda el fútbol americano, es un día de fiestas, festejos y reuniones familiares. ¿Pero qué es tan Súper?

Aparte de los entusiastas de los deportes o gracias a ellos, la popularidad del Super Bowl y de muchas otras formas de entretenimiento puede ser una respuesta a los sentimientos expresados en nuestra primera lectura de hoy de Job:

*"La vida del hombre en la tierra es visa de soldado
y sus días, como días de un jornalero.*

*Como el esclavo suspira en vano por la sombra
y el jornalero se queda aguardando su salario,
así me han tocado en suerte meses de infortunio
y se me han asignado noches de dolor. "*

Cuando la vida parece monótona y el sentido de nuestra existencia se ha desvanecido, los seres humanos buscamos distracciones o formas de escapar de una aparente falta de pasión o esperanza. Pero un partido de fútbol, por emocionante que sea, u otras distracciones sólo pueden darnos un breve descanso; nunca podrán proporcionar un significado o satisfacción duraderos, incluso si nuestro equipo favorito gana.

En contraste, la Buena Nueva de Jesucristo sí brindan verdadera esperanza y significado para nuestras vidas. La vida del hombre en la tierra es un trabajo pesado y sin esperanza para el que no tiene una relación con el Señor, porque hemos sido hechos para el Señor. Un tornillo sin tuerca, un hilo de pescar sin anzuelo o una piscina sin agua están incompletos. Podríamos decir que aún no han alcanzado su propósito, su cumplimiento. De manera similar, los seres humanos no sólo han sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios, sino que han sido creados para RELACIONES con el SEÑOR y con los demás. Vemos en la curación de la suegra de San Pedro, a Jesús restaurando no sólo su salud física, sino también su capacidad de servir a los demás nuevamente. La enfermedad puede aislar y centrar a la persona en sí misma: en su dolor, malestar y limitaciones.

Jesús, la Palabra hecha Carne, vino a revelar el Camino del regreso al Padre. No sólo nos enseñó con autoridad sobre el amor de nuestro Padre Eterno por nosotros y su actitud misericordiosa hacia los separados de él, sino que Jesús, como el Cordero de Dios, realmente nos reconcilia con el Padre. También nos modela la necesidad de cultivar una relación cada vez más profunda con el Padre. ¡Utilicemos esta próxima Cuaresma para crecer en nuestras relaciones con Dios!

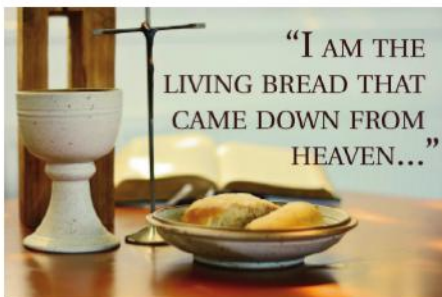
